



MARINE INSURANCE WORKSHOPS

4th Session – Freight Forwarder’s Liability Insurance on Wednesday, 27th March 2024

This is the 4th in a series of four bi-monthly workshops focusing on **“Freight Forwarder’s Liability Insurance”**, which is jointly co-organized by The Hong Kong Logistics Management Staff Association (HKLMSA), Marsh (Hong Kong) Limited, China Taiping Insurance (HK) Company Limited, C.Y. Tung International Centre for Maritime Studies (ICMS), and The Hong Kong Shippers’ Council. The workshops are at elementary level and should particularly appeal to the students and practitioners who start stepping into maritime industry and are interested in and/or wish to enrich their knowledge in marine insurance.

Speaker's Information

Mr. Eddie Au
